

Station 10



Jesus is nailed to the cross

Leader: We adore You, O Christ, and we bless You. **All:** Because by Your holy cross, You have redeemed the world.

The soldiers drove nails through Jesus' hands and feet as he was stretched out in pain on the cross. They lifted up the cross and put it in place. Even in all that pain and knowing he was going to die, Jesus' never complained, but prayed to God repeatedly: "Father, forgive them, for they don't know what they're doing."

Station 11



Jesus dies on the cross

Leader: We adore You, O Christ, and we bless You. **All**: Because by Your holy cross, You have redeemed the world.

Even in the final moments of his life, Jesus' eyes and heart were fixed on his father in heaven. He didn't plead to be let down, or ask to be saved by those watching, but trusted in God's plan for him, saying: "Father, I give up my spirit into your honds." When Jesus died, the sky went dark and the ground shook. Those watching knew that they had made a mistake.

Jesus is taken down and laid in the tomb

Leader: We adore You, O Christ, and we bless You. **All:** Because by Your holy cross, You have redeemed the world.

It was Joseph of Arimathea who bravely asked Pilate to give him Jesus so that he could bury him in his own tomb. Although he was at risk himself, his love and compassion was greater, and he was able to perform this final act for Jesus. To the rest of the world that day, Jesus had died and was buried, and had gone for ever. For us, the cross still stands before us as a symbol of our faith in Jesus Christ.






